Fun Facts About Square Dance

Square dancing developed long ago from a mix of English country dances and African American social dances. The typical formation is four couples in the shape of a square. However, all along the Appalachian Mountains it became popular to run square dance steps in large circle dances using as many couples as can fit on the floor. The Circle Dance often uses moves like the Right and Left Grand to continually have a dancer switch partners. This gives everyone a chance to dance with everyone and often breaks the ice for folks a little nervous about meeting others and asking them to dance. Today's square dancing has morphed into a multi-level dance program—whereas Traditional Square Dance had about 25 dance steps (known as 'calls') Modern Square Dancing has many programs (Basic, Social, Mainstream, Plus, Advanced and Challenge) with over 500 calls!
